Malachi "My Messenger"

The Name "Malachi"

- Means "my messenger"
- 1:1; 2:7; 3:1

Theme

- Rebuke, Return, Remember
- The Jewish people are back in their homeland, the temple has been completed and the city walls have been rebuilt
- They have many opportunities for spiritual and social prosperity but even after all God's blessings and warnings they have forsaken God and his will
- Both the priests and the people are guilty

Theme

- The people question God's rebukes
- God gives them final warnings and a promise that a messenger will come followed by the Lord (Messiah)
- God instructs the people to return to him but they refuse
- A future day of judgment is coming but those who fear God's name will be blessed
- "Elijah" will come before the great day of the Lord and will turn the hearts of the people

- In 539 BC Cyrus authorized the Jews to return to their homeland in Judah
- By the time of Malachi's prophecy Jews had been living in Israel for many years
- They had neglected God and God's Word
- Spiritual apostasy was the hallmark of the times

- Malachi wrote his prophecy between 435-430 BC—during the time of Ezra and Nehemiah (458-430 BC)
- The Hebrew people were back in their homeland after the Babylonian captivity
 - Zerubbabel led the first group in 536 BC;
 Cyrus was then king of Persia
 - They completed the temple in 516 BC during the reign of Darius I (Ezra 1-6)

- Ezra led the second group in 458 BC;
 Artaxerxes was king of Persia (Ezra 7-10)
- Nehemiah led the third group in 444 BC (Nehemiah 1-2)
- At the time of Malachi's ministry the temple had been completed and was again in service, the people were apathetic, distracted and rebellious toward God
- They were reaping divine discipline instead of divine blessing

- The activities in Malachi correspond to the problems Ezra and Nehemiah faced
 - The people did not support the temple with tithes and offerings (3:8-10; Neh. 13:10-12)
 - Intermarriage with pagans and also divorce had increased (2:10-16; Ezra 9:1-2; Neh. 13:1-3, 23-27)
 - Social injustice was prominent (3:5; Neh. 5:4-5)

Lessons We Can Learn

- The people of Malachi's day had experienced God's blessing, yet they became very apathetic and careless about doing God's work
 - Let's be spiritually enthusiastic (Rom. 12:11)!
- The priests and people observed the sacrifices and offerings contrary to God's will
 - We can allow communion, our singing and our worship degenerate into a meaningless ritual if we are not careful
 - Let's appreciate the privilege to worship and honor God

Lessons We Can Learn

- Marriage was under attack—the beginning of marriage was corrupted because God's people married pagans
- The end of marriage was corrupted because divorce was commonplace
- This is a social sin of our time also
- Christians should not marry unbelievers
- Divorce should be a last resort for a marriage God has joined together (Mt. 19:6)
- Let's work on having good marriages
